





Glossary: philabeg - a kind of kilt; guid - good; claymore - a two-handed sword; trepan - entrap or snare.

"plaid" should be pronounced with a soft "ay" sound (like "played") in order to slightly rhyme with "side".



(The whistled solo at the end would be more dramatically effective if done by a male singer, if available. Raising it by an octave is optional, depending on whistling range.)
